The Prodigal Sower

The prophet Isaiah (First Reading) tells us that God cares for the earth by sending rain to make it fruitful. And God cares for us by sending us his word. Our reading emphasis the effectiveness of God's word. The rain always produces positive results; eventually somewhere the earth responds and becomes fruitful. So God persists with his word until he gets a response.

The parable of the sower echoes that same idea: the word of God achieves the end for which it was sent. Despite the hard ground, predatory birds, stones, thorns, and weeds, the seed finally finds some good soil and produces a harvest....in some cases even a hundred per cent. The parable is telling us that despite all obstacles the word of God *will* bear fruit.

But you might wonder at the carelessness of the sower. The sower sowed the seed haphazardly. Yes, some seed did fall on good ground. But some fell on the hard path, some on ground littered with stones, and some among thorns and briars. You might say that the sower was wasteful and foolish. One could not imagine any farmer scattering seed in such a fashion.

But there is another way of looking at this. You could say that the sower was extremely generous, even prodigal, with the seed. He was determined to give every part of the field a chance to produce something. Of course, the poorer parts would not be expected to produce as much as the more fertile parts.

The sower in the parable is an image of God. God scatters the seed around in a display of reckless generosity. Our God is like that - he sows the precious seed of his word in the most unlikely places.

In his love, God is continually calling us to a better and more fruitful life.

We are not just hearers of the word, we are also sowers of the word. This is particularly true in the case of parents, teachers, and preachers. But to some extent it is true of us all. Jesus' parable is a very encouraging one for sowers. It tells them not to be discouraged if no *product* is apparent. Their job is to go on sowing the good seed and not to get discouraged.

We must leave the harvest to God.
