The Highs And Lows Of Peter

Peter is at the centre of today's Gospel. There he makes a marvellous profession of faith in Jesus. Jesus reacts by conferring the primacy on him (this shows that the primacy was not something that was invented by the Church later on. It went right back to the beginning, to the mind and will of Christ himself).

But why did Jesus confer the primacy on Peter and not on any of the others?

It is clear that Peter had leadership qualities. In all four Gospels he is the one who is mentioned most frequently, and who speaks most frequently. Indeed, very often, he acts as spokesman for the Twelve. And whenever the twelve apostles are listed, his name is always first. His great profession of faith in Jesus was one of his finest moments.

Yet the Gospels do not spare Peter. True, they show that there was a solid side to his character but they also show there was an expecite side of him. On the night, losus was

character but they also show there was an opposite side of him. On the night Jesus was on trial for his life, instead of standing by him, Peter denied him not once but three times. That was his lowest moment.

The Peter who said, 'You are the Christ, the Son of the living God,' was the same Peter who said, 'I do not know this man.' Still, we might be inclined to say that the first Peter was the real Peter. This would be a mistake - there was only one Peter.

No one would have been surprised had Jesus written off Peter at this point, as being a coward, weak and unreliable. But he did not. Instead he restored him to where he was before, and made him the chief shepherd of his flock. Why? Because Jesus knew that there was another and better side of Peter. Generosity and selfishness, courage and cowardice can co-exist in the same person.

Compared to Judas whose betrayal was a planned one, and was carried out in a cold, calculating manner. Peter's denial was not planned and was the result of weakness rather than malice. Peter did not fall because he was weak, he fell because he thought he was strong. He learned two great lessons from that experience. Firstly, he learned a painful truth about himself - he wasn't as strong and brave as he thought he was. And secondly, he learned a wonderful truth about Jesus. In spite of his denials, Jesus still loved him. It was his love that enabled him to turn an hour of pain and shame into an hour of grace and salvation. God does not choose perfect people to do his work - there are no such people. Peter is a great consolation to us. The frailties we see in him we recognize in ourselves.
