With Privilege Comes Responsibility

Peter and Anne raised four children but are now alone. They feel disappointed and sad. Anne tells us why.

'We did everything we could for those children. We wanted them to have the things we didn't have. Times were hard and life was a constant struggle. Still those children never lacked anything. They had a lot of illnesses when they were young, many nights we did not get a wink of sleep. Peter and I never went out. We saw others going abroad for their holidays, something we could not afford. But we gladly sacrificed these things for the sake of the children. We sent them to good schools, taught them their religion. We taught them good values. And just look at how they have repaid us.

'John (the oldest) went into the pub business. He works hard, his business is doing well. He sends us a couple of bottles at Christmas but we hardly ever see him.

Money seems to have become his god.'

'Anne, a teacher, married a fellow with a big job. They don't believe in having children. They rarely come to see us, though we get cards from them when they go for holidays to some exotic places.'

'Peter has three children and seemed to be happily married. But then he suddenly left his wife and went to live with a younger woman. He never shows up.'

'Paul, (the youngest) is still unmarried. He does not believe in working or settling down. Last time we heard from him he was somewhere in Australia.'

Today's readings seem to suggest that even God sometimes feels like this. The people of Israel has been treated in a privileged manner by God. But privilege brings

responsibility. God looked for peace from his people but He got war; for true worship, He got idolatry; for justice, He got corruption; for goodness, He got evil; for sharing, He got greed. God sent messenger after messenger (prophets) but they were abused and killed. God was disappointed in the people, not for his own sake, but for theirs. This to some extent is our story too. God wants us to make good use of the gifts and

opportunities but often we fail to respond. We fail not just as individuals but also as a Church. The Christian community is the vineyard Christ planted and for which he gave his life. He looks to us, the tenants of his vineyard, to produce the fruits of justice, love and peace. It's a great privilege but a great challenge too.


