Allegiance To God Comes First

The most important part of a ship is the rudder. Without the rudder it could not be steered. It would simply run amuck. The most precious thing we possess is our *conscience*. Without a conscience we could not steer the barque of our lives towards the harbour of truth and right. As Christians God must always have the first claim on our conscience.

Franz Jägerstätter was born in Austria and was brought up a Catholic. He was an unremarkable young man who had only an elementary education and who became a casual worker. There was nothing about him to suggest that he had in him the stuff of martyrs.

However, at some stage he suddenly matured. He became very responsible and began to take his religion seriously. He was not, however, fanatical about it. He married a girl by the name of Anna, and they had three children.

By the time the Second World War was raging, Franz (at 36) was called up to serve in Hitler's army. But he refuses to join up. This was the equivalent to suicide.

When friends tried to talk him into joining up, he said simply, 'I cannot join.'

'But many have joined up....so why can't you?' they persisted.

'Because I believe that this war is not a *just* war. Therefore, it would be wrong for me to join up. What others do is their business. I have to answer for my own conscience.'

'But where's your loyalty to your people, to your country, and to your flag?' they continued. 'I love my people and I love my country. But there's a higher law - God's law. And God's law tells me that this war is wrong.'

Franz did not have a death wish. He had a lot to live for. Further efforts were made to get him to change his mind. He was arrested and put in prison. Even his wife begged him to reconsider his decision....but all to no avail.

Franz Jägerstätter was executed on August 9, 1943. He felt he was obeying the words of Christ "Give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and to God what belongs to God." He was beatified by Pope Benedict XVI in 2007.

Every Christian living in today's world is faced with difficult decisions. Franz showed us that whatever else we might give to Caesar, we must not give him our conscience. A true Christian is at one and the same time a good citizen of his country and of the kingdom of God. But his first and deepest loyalty is to God. **FLOR McCARTHY SDB**

Divine Mercy Devotion


