Next morning the swallow was found dead at the base of the statue. By now the statue was bare, having been stripped of all its ornaments. The prince had given away all his riches but he could not have done so without his faithful messenger, the little swallow.

Christ, our King, gave himself totally while he lived on earth. Even as he died, he was still giving to those who were receptive. And from his lofty perch in heaven he surveys the plight of God's children on earth. He needs messengers. He needs us. He has no hands but ours, no feet or tongue but ours. And it is his riches that we are called to dispense - his love, his forgiveness, his mercy, his good news......

What is involved is helping in simple things - giving a hungry person something to eat, welcoming a stranger or visiting someone who is sick or in prison. To do things such as these one does not have to be either wealthy or talented. All we need is a warm and willing heart.

Everyone can do something - yes, even a little 'swallow'.
