Keeping the Commandments

Once there was a very sincere man who wished to live a holy life. So he went to his rabbi for advice. The rabbi congratulated him on his ambition, then asked, 'How have you been faring so far?'

'Quite well, I think' the man replied.

'When you say well, what do you mean?' the rabbi asked.

'I have not broken any of the commandments. I have not taken the Lord's name in vain. I have not profaned the Sabbath day. I have not dishonoured my father or mother. I have not killed anyone. I have not been unfaithful to my wife. I have not stolen from anybody. I have not borne false witness against anyone. I have not coveted my neighbour's wife or goods,' the man replied.

'I see. So you haven't broken any of the commandments.....but have you *kept* the commandments?' the rabbi asked.

'What do you mean?' said the man.

'I mean have you honoured God's holy name? Have you kept holy the Sabbath day? Have you loved and honoured your parents? Have you sought to preserve and defend life? When did you last tell your wife that you loved her? Have you shared your goods with the poor? Have you defended the good name of anyone? When did you last put yourself out there to help a neighbour?' replied the rabbi.

The man was completely taken aback. He went away and reflected on what the rabbi had said. He soon realized that he has been more focused on avoiding all wrongdoings than anything else. But the rabbi offered him a new vision which not only included the above commandments but positive concept of goodness. He had given him a new and better compass to guide him.

We must be careful not to make the same mistake that man made. We must not approach the commandments in a negative way because this leads to *minimalism* - doing the bare minimum. We must approach them in a positive way.

Jesus said that all of God's laws could be reduced to two: *love of God* and *love of neighbour*. These two, properly understood, include all the others. In a sense, there is only one law - *the law of love*. And there is one sin - *not to love*.
