

# Finding One's Work

We invest a huge amount of our lives in work. Hence, the way we regard our work is of the greatest importance. If our work has meaning, it can become a blessing. But if it has no meaning, it can become a curse.

What's the difference between the good shepherd and the hireling?

It is the contrasting attitudes they bring to the work of shepherding. The hireling does it because they have to. For them it is just a job; their heart is not in it. The good shepherd does it because they want to; their heart is in it.

People like the good shepherd are very fortunate. They haven't just found a work, they have found a *vocation* in life. They have an occupation into which they can put their hearts and which creates an outlet for their talents. Work can bring out the best in us. It is no exaggeration to say that it becomes the road to salvation.

Even though work may be difficult and unspectacular, it glows with meaning because it is a labour of love. Even though we may be facing some difficulties and hardships, deep down we are contented. We must never equate a happy life with an easy life. The harder the task to which we give ourselves for love's sake, the more it will exalt us. True happiness comes from the joy of deeds well done.

The best prize that life offers is a chance to work hard at something that is worth doing. How marvellous it is to have something in one's life that we are passionate about, even if it proves a crucifixion at times.

Jesus found his work. It consisted in being a good shepherd to the Father's flock. Two characteristics mark the relationship between the good shepherd and his sheep. First, he cares about his sheep to the point where he is willing to die and defend them. Second, he knows his sheep and they know him. Needless to say we are not sheep. We are God's children as St John reminds us and God wants us to have a life and hereafter.


From that day on his life changed. It was not that it suddenly became easy. It was a process. In a letter to his brother, Theo, he wrote: 'I think it is a great blessing when people find their work. I often feel that I am as rich as Croesus (ancient King of Lydia - Turkey in present day), not in money, however. I am rich because I have found in my work something to which I can devote myself heart and soul and which gives meaning and inspiration to my life. This is not the road on which one perishes. On the contrary, this is a powerful stream that will bear me safely to port.'

From this point on, Vincent no longer doubted himself and no matter how difficult his life was, the inward serenity and the conviction of his own calling never deserted him.
