Abraham's Journey and Ours

There are many great journeys in the Bible. One of the most important is that of Abraham (First Reading). At the word of God he left all the usual securities of life such as home, family, country and set out for a foreign destination.

Abraham's journey is one that emigrants can identify with in a special way. But all of us can identify with it because all of us are travellers on this earth. This is true even for the person who has never left home. And while we are on a common journey, each one's journey is unique.

Abraham's journey was fraught with difficulties. It literally was a journey into the unknown. However, he had one marvellous asset, namely, faith in God. That faith provided him with a compass for his journey.

In many respects the journey of life is a journey into the unknown. Blessed are those who possess the compass of faith. We also need to know that our earthly journey has a destination. Our faith assures us that it is the kingdom of God.

Without faith and hope, the journey of life, no matter how pleasurable it might be, would be robbed of ultimate meaning. In essence, it would be a journey to nowhere. But if we do have it, life will be voyage to the promised land of eternal life. The hardships encountered on route will add to the joy of arrival.

Because God had called him, Abraham knew that God would not abandon him. He trusted that God would guide him to his unknown destination. In his love for us, God has sent a special guide – his Son, Jesus.

Here is what we learned from Abraham's journey: he took a leap of faith - his journey began with a command from God. He showed obedience, even with the most difficult command, over emotion. He showed courage and trust by taking action on the spot and knowing that he would have God as his guide throughout his journey and divine provisions.

His journey was not one of perfection but through God's mercy we understood the importance of striving despite imperfections.

He demonstrated endurance and offering hope for others to follow God's guidance in their own lives.

Medjugorje Pilgrimage 2026

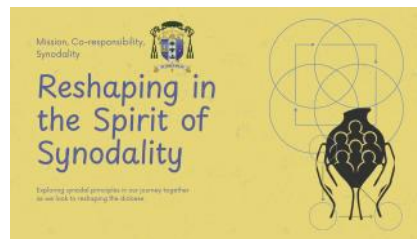

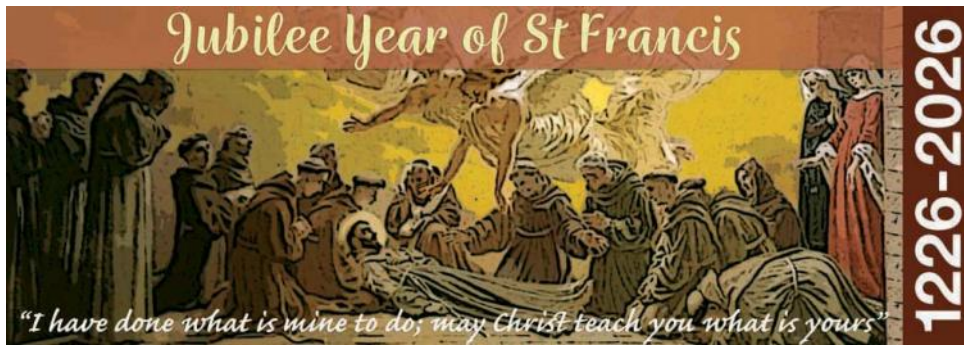
