## *Handling Anger*

It is impossible to live without getting angry at one time or another. Now, we may have been taught that anger is sinful - in fact, it is one of the seven deadly sins (wrath). As a result, we feel guilty about getting angry and are tempted to deny or repress it.

The first thing that needs to be said is that anger is normal and even healthy. If we love and value ourselves, we will naturally get angry if we are being treated badly. We should not deny our anger. It is a feeling after all which in itself is neither good nor bad morally.

Psychologists tell us that repressed anger is very dangerous and can result in self-hatred, depression and even bodily ills such as ulcers. It needs to be released but this must be done in a wholesome way. When anger is given a means of expression relief follows.

When Jesus says to us, 'Do not get angry with your brother,' he is condemning anger in itself. After all, he himself got angry when he drove the traders out of the temple. There are times when we ought to be angry. An unjust situation should make us angry. Anger can be a good thing, it spurs us to make the situation right. But beware if we find ourselves angry often - we should look at the cause of our anger. The cause may lie with us.....we have to look at ourselves. Some people are full of anger which makes them very difficult to live with. Instead of owning their anger, they direct it onto others. If the cause of our anger lies with another person, we must look at our relationship with that person. Still when all is said and done, anger is not a good resting place. If our heart is filled with anger, there is no room in it for love.

Therefore, we would do well to heed the advice of St Paul, 'Do not let the sun go down on our anger' (Eph 4:26).

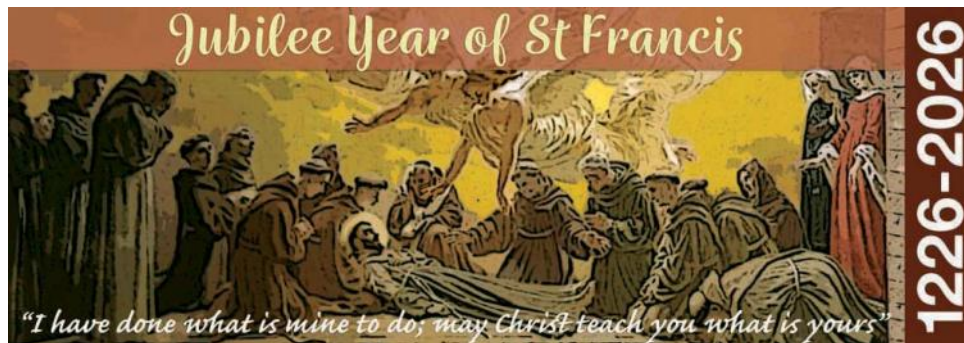
