The Purpose of Penance

We have just begun Lent.

When we think of Lent we think of penance. Most Christians undertake some penance for Lent. This is a good and worthwhile practice.

There was a very earnest young man who wanted to become a rabbi. He went to see an elderly rabbi for advice. It was wintertime. The rabbi stood at the window looking out into the yard while the rabbinical candidate gave him a glowing accounting of his piety and austere lifestyle.

The young man said, 'I always dress in spotless white like the sages of old. I never drink any alcoholic beverages, only water ever passes my lips. I perform numerous penances. For instances, I always carry sharpened-edged nails inside my shoes to mortify myself. Even in the coldest weather, I lie naked in the snow to punish my flesh. And to complete my penance, I take a dozen lashes everyday on my bare back.'

As the young man spoke, a stable boy led a white horse into the yard and took him to the water trough. The horse drank his fill of water and having done so, rolled in the snow as horses sometimes do.

'Just look....that animal too is dressed in white. It also drinks nothing but water, has nails in his shoes and rolls naked in the snow. Also rest assured, it gets its daily ration of lashes from his master. Now I ask you, is it a saint or is it a horse?' We may come to ask ourselves, what is the purpose of penance?

Penance is not meant to undo the past - the past is done. Nor is it meant to persuade God to erase our sins and forgo the punishment we deserve for them. The first thing we do when we undertake penance is to acknowledge that we are sinners. The second thing is to express the desire to change our lives. The whole object of penance is to reform a sinful way of life.

Penance is an exercise in saying 'no' to ourselves. Its purpose is to acquaint us with our better side and to convince ourselves that we can do better. It means taking a step in the right direction. When people are pruning a fruit tree, they are not doing it to punish the tree but to enable it to produce more and better fruit. Same applies to our penances as the goal is to lead us to a new and better life. Lent provides us with a window of opportunity to look at ourselves to see how we can become better followers of Christ.

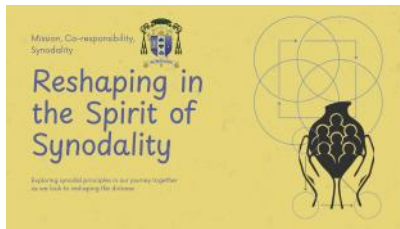

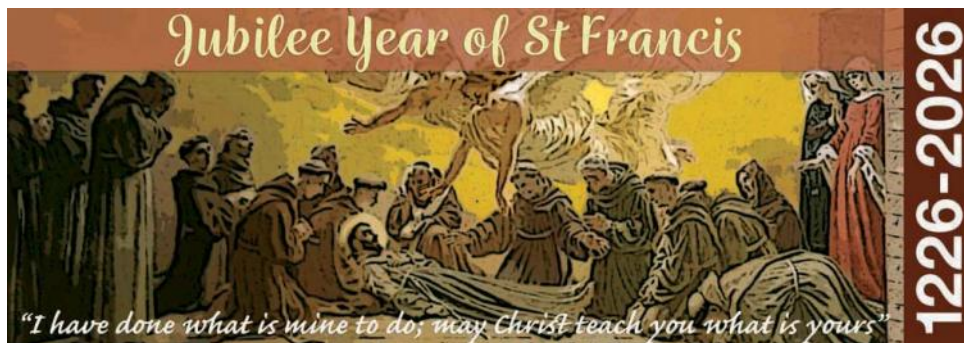
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In the desert Jesus triumphed over the devil through prayer, fasting and obedience to the word of God.
