



The Gift of Living Water

What is the most precious commodity on earth?

Oil? No, even though a lot of wars have been fought over it. Gold? Diamonds? No, even though many people have given their lives to acquire them. The most precious commodity with which our earth has been blessed is water. Yes, ordinary water. Why? Because without it there would be no life on earth.

In some countries there is such an abundance of water that it tends to be taken for granted. Moreover, it is readily available - all one has to do is to turn on a tap. But in other countries water is extremely scarce and people have to travel long distances to get it. In those countries people tend to have a greater appreciation of water.

Water is used for cleaning and cooking but its chief property is to give life. Nothing can live or grow without water. We could live several weeks without food but we cannot survive more than a few days without water. Water is not so much a necessity of life - *it is life!*

Jesus too needed water. In today's Gospel, St John presents him as completely human. He shows him sitting by a well in the noontday sun, weary and thirsty. We don't often think of Jesus in that way. When a Samaritan woman came to the well to draw water he asked her for a drink, and she gave it to him. She was a lost woman and regarded as an outcast from her community. Yet Jesus had one of the most profound conversations with her.

Water is also a powerful symbol. Jesus used water to talk to the woman about something deeper. He began to talk to her about another kind of thirst and another kind of water. At first she had no idea what Jesus was talking about. Yet when she reflected on her life, she began to understand what he was trying to say. She understood that there was another kind of thirst - the thirst for love, happiness and meaning. She had been married not once, but five times. Yet she still hadn't found what she was looking for.

She had been searching for love and happiness. Jesus didn't judge her. Ever so gently, he showed her that up to now she had been looking for the right thing, that is love, but in the wrong places. He explained to her that what she was experiencing was a thirst in the human heart that affects everyone and for this deeper thirst we need another kind of 'water'.
