## **Jesus: The Source of Eternal Life**

Everyone needs friends, even Jesus. In the village of Bethany, he had three very special friends - Martha, Mary and their brother, Lazarus. Their house remained open to him when many other houses were being closed against him.

When Lazarus got sick, it was only natural that the sisters should turn to Jesus for help. They sent an urgent message to him: 'Lord, the man you love is ill.'

Who could resist a request like that? Surprisingly, Jesus didn't drop everything and rush to the bedside of his dying friend. Instead, he stayed on where he was for two more days. His delay in coming must have been heart-breaking for the sisters. Right in front of their eyes their brother's life was ebbing away. And the one they believed could save him wasn't there. We can identify with their disappointment. When something bad happens to us or to a loved one, we may feel abandoned by God. We can't help thinking if God really loved us, he wouldn't have allowed this to happen. Lazarus died.

The Gospel shows the desolation his death caused to Martha and Mary. It's a desolation many of us have experienced around the death of a loved one. While they had sympathetic people around them, it was not the same as having the presence of Jesus among them. His absence was felt deeply by the sisters.

When he finally came, Martha said to him, 'If you had been there, our brother would not have died,' thereby suggesting that he could have prevented his death. But Jesus challenged her to believe that he could still save Lazarus: '*I am the resurrection and the life. Anyone who believes in me will never die*' (eternally).

In defiance of the evidence, she declared, 'I believe that you are Christ, the son of God, the one who was to come into the world.'

There was a happy ending for Martha and Mary - Lazarus was restored to them. However, there is no suggestion that he wouldn't have died again. Clearly, he did die again. But that is not the main point of John's story. The point of the story is contained in Jesus' declaration to Martha.

Jesus' purpose in coming into this world was to give us the life that cannot be touched by death, the kind of life that only God possesses. Those who believe in Jesus and who follow him, enter into a relationship with God which death cannot end. That is what the story is about. Even though there are no happy endings in our stories, we are called to be inspired by Martha's faith.
