Palm Sunday

As Jesus enters into his final week, he takes humanity with him and continues to do so every Easter. We are not just remembering an historical event that happened over two thousand years ago. We are celebrating and taking part in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus as it happens today to us and for us.

His entry into the city begins on a huge wave of optimism, joy and hope. The people line the streets; they wave palms, they put their cloaks and garments on the ground and they shout out his name. This was an ancient Roman tradition used to welcome soldiers and armies home after their success in battle. The crowd welcomes Jesus in a similar way as they shout out: *Hosanna, Hosanna, blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.*

By the end of next week he will share a meal with his family and friends. He will offer himself to them through bread and wine. He will wash the feet of those who are at the table with him. There will be betrayal from Judas and denials from Peter. Then Pilate will condemn him to death. The soldiers will beat him and make him carry his own cross. On the way to Calvary, Simon will be forced to help him carry his cross. Veronica will push her way through the crowd and wipe his face with compassion. We hear this story every year and we become used to it and perhaps a bit overly familiar with it and what it means to us.

The invitation and question that Palm Sunday puts before us is: ***where am I as Jesus is going through all of this?***

At the beginning of Lent Jesus said to each of us 'Take up your cross and follow me.' Am I still walking with him or am I hiding safely at the back of the crowd keeping my distance? Where am I as Jesus carries his cross?

Mary, the Mother of Jesus, is a great disciple of the Holy Week. She followed him and stayed with him every step of the way. She has the courage, strength and faith to stand with the other women as he died. As we begin our own journey through the dramatic events of the Holy Week can we stand with Mary?

Can we be inspired by her and withdraw courage and strength from her so we too can stay with Jesus?

The journey of Holy Week doesn't begin nor end at Calvary. But before we can stand at the empty tomb with Mary Magdalene we have to travel with Jesus as he carries his cross and stands on the Hill of Calvary.
