Seeing Is Not Necessarily Believing

Thomas was not the only apostle to doubt the resurrection. The three synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark and Luke) make it clear that all the apostles initially doubted but John dramatized that doubt in one individual namely Thomas.

At the Last Supper Thomas interrupted the discourse given by Jesus and said, 'Lord, we do not know where you are going so how can we know the way?' It is clear that Thomas was loyal but also demanding answers. When the other apostles told him that they had seen Jesus, he was reluctant and replied, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into those holes and into his side, I refuse to believe.'

The second time Jesus met with the apostles, he came primarily to meet Thomas where he invited him to put his hands on his side and to feel the holes in his hands in order to gain the proof he desired. Now was the chance to demonstrate that "*seeing is believing*".

Yet it is clear from John's narrative that Thomas did not accept the Lord's invitation. Instead he responded: '*My Lord and my God.*' This is the highest profession of faith in all of the Gospels.

In the mere seeing of the glorified Lord, Thomas had learnt that touch and sight were not the sufficient things he had supposed. In a strangely paradoxical way he had found through seeing that seeing was not necessarily believing. And this makes Thomas the link between the first believers (the apostles) and the believers of every age who make the same confession of faith.

The Gospel of John often points out that seeing miracles does not always lead to true belief. Many witnessed Jesus' miracles but still did not believe, or even opposed him.

The miracles and signs in John's Gospel were fundamentally recorded to provoke faith in readers who could not witness the events in person.

While Thomas needed to see to believe, Jesus teaches that faith based purely on His Word (without the need for physical evidence) creates a more stable, unchanging trust.

The blessedness of belief applies to those who believe, not to those who see.

This is the universal beatitude in which John closes his Gospel.
