



The Leave-Taking

The parting of friends is never easy. But some partings are harder than others. The most painful parting of all happens when someone dies. What makes this parting different from all others is the finality of it.

It was the night before Jesus' death. For some time he had been giving the apostles hints of his death. Now he talked to them openly about it. Except he didn't speak of death the way we tend to do - in the sense of life ending.

He spoke of his death as a going away, '*going to the Father*'. But all the apostles heard was the fact that he was leaving them. Yes, he was indeed leaving them but there are degrees of leaving. There is a leaving that implies abandonment such as a girl who had hopes of marriage suddenly finds her fiancé leaving her. Sadly, now and again we hear about children and elderly being neglected and abandoned. To be abandoned is the most painful and damaging emotion that can happen to anyone. In the Gospel we are not dealing with a situation of this nature. Jesus is not abandoning his apostles.

There is a leaving that is necessary because it is good of the one leaving. For instance, a person who has to travel but will be returning home, or leaving to take up a better job somewhere else. Jesus' leaving is for his own good. He is returning to his Father and to return to the Father is to go home.

There is a leaving for the good of the one leaving and of those left behind. Jesus was leaving and as a result of his departure he was sending the Holy Spirit to the apostles. His departure will not leave them unsupported and unguided as they were mostly in fears. 'I will not leave you orphans,' he had said to them.

Even when he was gone, by their faith the apostles were able to see him and through their obedience to his commandments, they were drawn into a loving communion with him and with the Father. Jesus does not leave us orphaned either. We have the same access to his presence and to the help of the Holy Spirit as the first Christians had.
