The Ascension of the Lord

Presence and Absence

St Luke's account of the ascension seems to emphasize the fact that Jesus is *going away*. This means that he will no longer be with the apostles, or with us. However, the story is not so much about Jesus leaving as about Jesus *being glorified*. That is where the emphasis is and that is what this great feast is all about.

It is true that on Ascension Day Jesus withdrew his physical presence from the apostles. The ascension marked the termination of his earthly appearances. Physical appearance is a great thing, but it isn't everything. Many of our disappointments in life are caused by the fact that seeing and touching do not always create the closeness we seek. Two people can be physically close, and yet live separate, lonely lives because there is no meeting of minds and hearts. On the other hand, people can be separated by thousands of miles and yet feel close to one another. When people think of each other with love, a spiritual bond is created between them and they enter into an intimate relationship. For those who love one another there is no such place as far away. If we are able to be fully present to our friends when we are with them, our absence too will bear fruit. The memory of that presence, the warmth of it will continue to nourish them. Thus, not only our presence but also our absence becomes a gift.

Jesus' ascension was a journey back to the Father to be glorified. We must not think that he has abandoned us, that he has gone back to where he really belongs after his time on earth. If this were so then Christianity would be no more than a remembrance religion.

Today's Gospel ends with Jesus' promise to remain with his disciples right to the end of time. The ascension represents his liberation from all restrictions of time and space. During his earthly ministry he could only be in one place at a time. But now that he is united with God, he is present wherever God is present.....and that is everywhere.
