



The Miracle of Change

After Pentecost the apostles were changed people. That is the real miracle of Pentecost. However, it is a mistake to think that the change came about in an instant. It had to be a gradual thing, a growth process set in motion by the action of the Holy Spirit. Growth happens gradually.

Though we are dealing with mystery that doesn't mean we cannot understand anything about it. Let us look at how spring goes about its work of change and renewal.

Each year in Ireland towards the middle of March you will see patches of green begin to appear in the fields and on the hillsides. Day by day the patches get bigger. A month or so later spring will replace the old garment with a completely new garment.

Yet spring doesn't make anything happen. It is only a facilitator. It merely creates a climate in which things can grow. The new life comes from within. It cannot be imposed but a response is needed otherwise all spring's efforts will be in vain. What spring does is provide living things with the opportunity and impulse to realize what is already inside them in a germinal state. This is achieved in a gentle way. One good thing about nature is that it is incapable of deception. It does not put on an outward show when there is nothing inside.

People too need to renew themselves. This renewal just like nature cannot be imposed. Many people carry profound pains into their spirits sometimes encounter individuals who attempt to force them into a rigid mould or behaviour. What we need is someone to awaken us to what is already inside us, to bid us live and help us grow. But as we know growth is slow and can be painful at times. We don't let go easily of the old garment, old attitudes, old habits. This probably accounts for the fact that many people are left unawakened and die without having experienced even one spring in their lifetime!

What happened to the apostles at Pentecost can happen to us too.
